

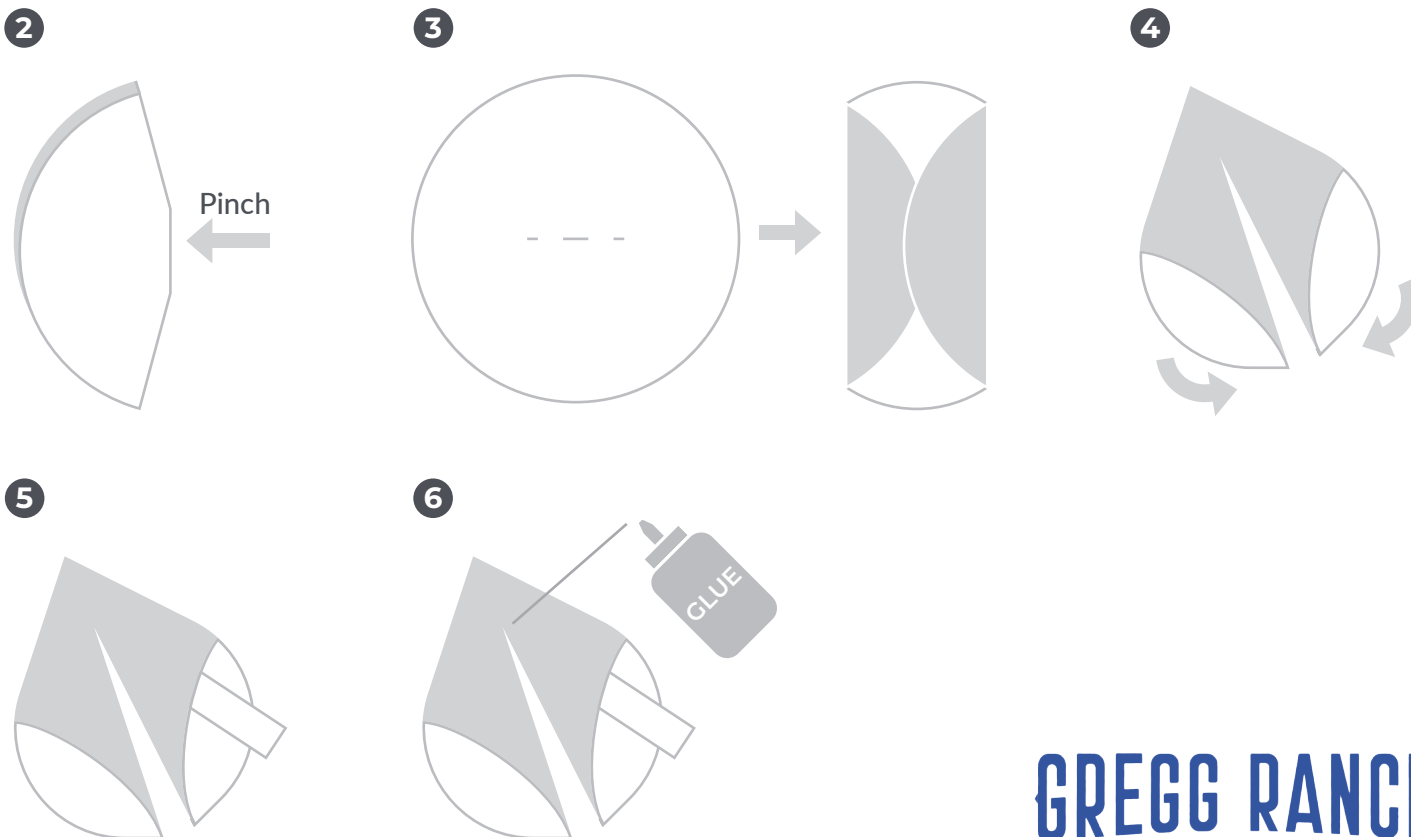
INSTRUCTIONS: New Year's Paper Fortune Cookies

SUPPLIES

- White construction or printer paper
- White glue or glue stick
- Scissors

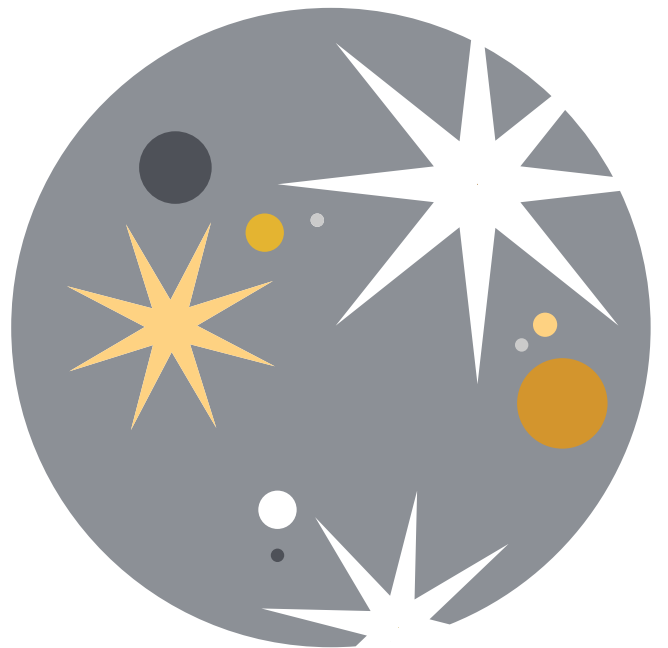
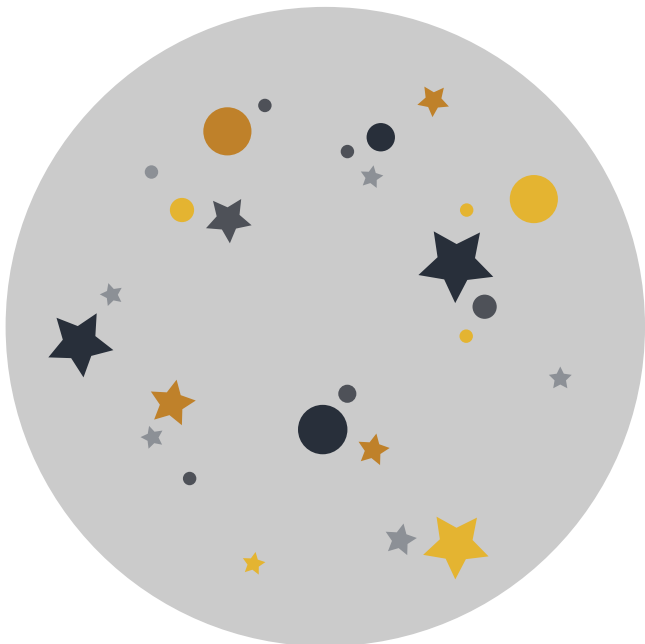
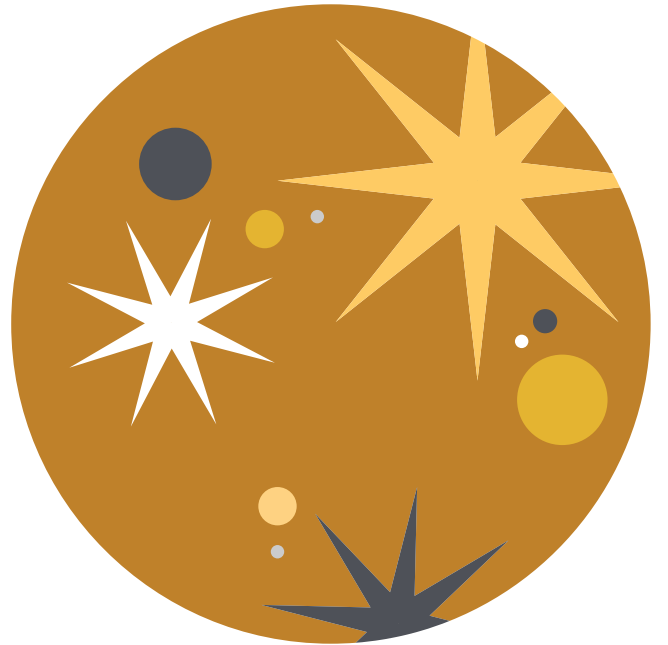
INSTRUCTIONS

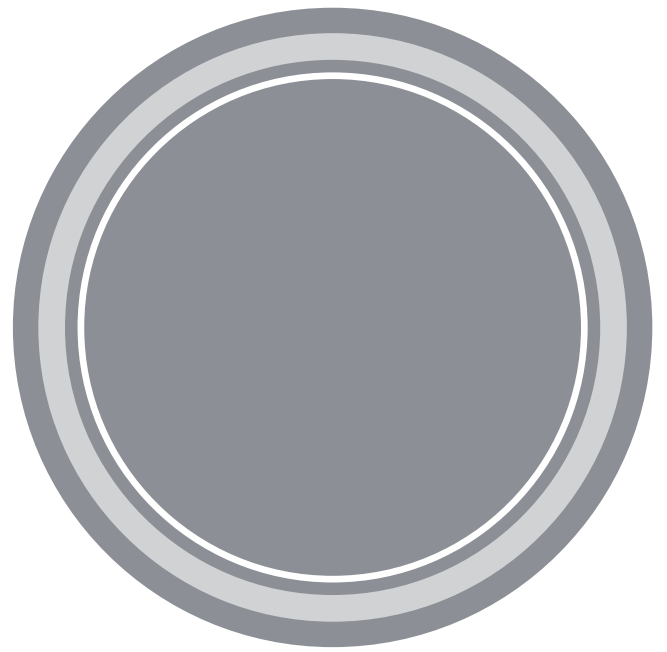
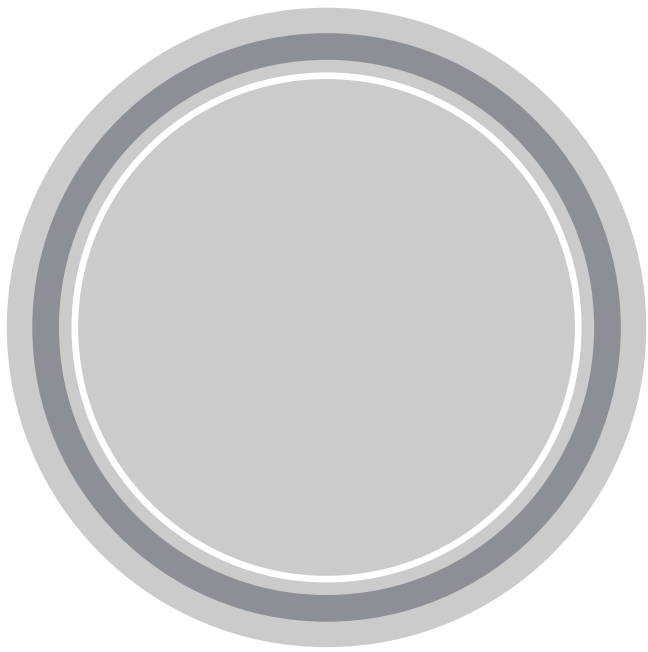
1. Print & trim out the fortune cookie circles.
2. Taking one circle, gently fold it in half with the printed color inside, and pressing down with your thumb to crease only the very center of the circle.
3. Unfold the circle and then flip the circle around and gently overlap the sides of the circle over each other to create a roll with the creased seam bisecting the roll horizontally.
4. With one hand, pinch the overlapped sides to keep the tube rolled. With the other hand, place your thumb in one end of the roll and your middle finger in the other, and use your pointer finger to press inward on the seam while pulling the tube ends towards each other to create the iconic fortune cookie shape.
5. Gently unfold your fortune cookie to add the fortune inside and then refold the cookie. The fortune can be added before or after folding, but I often found it got in my way during the folding process.
6. To help your fortune cookies retain their shape, place a little bit of glue in the back of the crease & then hold together until the glue has dried. Optionally, a paper clip can be used to hold the two sides together while the glue dries.
7. Your New Year's Paper Fortune Cookies are complete! As a bonus, they make a great addition to any New Year's Mini Gift Bags!
